Harold "Hal" McRae was born July 10, 1945 in Avon Park, FL. He graduated from E.O. Douglas High School in Sebring, FL. Later he attended Florida A&M University and played baseball for the FAMU Rattlers, where he has since been inducted into the Florida A&M University Sports Hall of Fame. Hal was drafted from FAMU by the Cincinnati Reds organization in the 6th round of the 1965 draft with the 117th overall pick.

In 1972, Mr. McRae was traded to the Royals and developed as a consistent designated hitter in the American League. His career spanned 23 years, including 14 seasons with Kansas City. Selected a three-time All-Star, he hit over .300 six times for the Royals and was named "Designated Hitter of the Year" by *The Sporting News* and *the Associated Press*. By 1976 McRae was on top of the American League batting title race and finished fourth in the American League "Most Valuable Player" voting. In 1985, he was once again recognized among most valuable players when he led the majors and set a Royals record with 133 RBI. Mr. McRae went on to play in a total of 48 post season games, including four World Series, where he was a .400 hitter in 17 World Series games. In 1989, Mr. McRae was inducted into the Royals Hall of Fame.

In his 19 year major league career, Mr. McRae posted a .290 batting average (2091-for-7218) with 191 home runs, 1097 RBI, 484 doubles, 65 triples, and 109 stolen bases in 2084 games played. He added a .351 on base percentage and a .454 slugging average for a combined .805 OPS. Mr. McRae played so hard that that the rule requiring a runner to slide into second base when breaking up a double play is still referred to as the Hal McRae Rule in honor of the man whose cross-body blocks into second base broke up many double plays and second basemen at the same time.

Hal McRae later became the hitting instructor for the Montreal expos in 1990, Cincinnati in 1995 and 1996, and Philadelphia from 1997-2000. Mr. McRae joined the Tampa Bay organization and remained with them for four seasons, having joined their staff on November 7, 2000, when he was named bench coach. He took over as the manager of the Devil Rays on April 18, 2001, remaining in that position through the 2002 season. He spent the 2003 and 2004 seasons with the Devil Rays organization as a Special Assistant to the General Manager. Hal McRae was named as the Cardinals hitting coach on December 6, 2004. Also in 2004, he was inducted into the Missouri Sports Hall of fame.

Other notable career achievements include Mr. McRae's induction into the State of Florida Hall of Fame, and the placement of a star plaque, distinguishing him as a notable Florida sportsman on the "Star Walk" in front of Tropicana Field in St. Petersburg, FL. Additionally, the street upon which Mr. McRae grew up in Avon Park was named Hal McRae Blvd., located South on Highway 27, just following the intersection of State Road 64.

Johncyna "Jo" Williams McRae was born and raised in Bradenton, Florida. She is a product of the Manatee County School System. She graduated from Lincoln Memorial High School in Palmetto, Florida. She comes from a family of teachers with deep roots in the community. Her grandparents met through teaching. Her mother and uncle both taught as well, and like their mother, both Mrs. McRae and her sister became teachers. Mrs. McRae's daughter also teaches in Manatee County. Additionally, her brother and nephew both graduated from the University of Florida's Law School. A school is named for Mrs. McRae's mother in Manatee County – the Annie Lucy Williams Elementary School, which opened in the fall of 2007. Mrs. Annie Lucy Combs Williams was also named a charter member of Manatee County Rural Health Services, Inc.

After graduating from the University of Florida in 1966 with a Bachelor of Arts in Education Degree, Mrs. McRae taught at Riverview High School in Sarasota, Florida and Southeast High School in Bradenton, Florida. She also worked part-time in the basic Skills Instruction Adult computer lab for Manatee County Schools. She later retired from teaching to be a full-time wife and mother.

Mrs. McRae believes it takes volunteers with vision, energy, and wisdom to enrich a community. During the six months she was traveling in support of her husband Hal McRae's career as a player, coach, and manager in professional baseball, she was selflessly sharing her time and knowledge volunteering in Manatee County.

The roster of Manatee County community service organizations Mrs. McRae belongs to is diverse and impressive. They include the Junior League of Manatee County, Kiwanis Club of Bradenton, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., The Order of the Eastern Star, Delta Kappa Gamma Society, Inc. and the United Way of Manatee County. She currently serves on the board of the South Florida Museum.

She has received awards for community service from the College Fund/UNCF, Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc., The Florida Department of Health, and the Wellness Community of Southwest Florida.

Mrs. McRae and her husband, Hal McRae are the parents of three children, Brian (Melea), Cullen, and Leah (Renay Houston, Jr.) and the grandparents of Alyssiana McRae (9), Wesley Houston (5), Addison McRae (4), Cullen McRae II (3), and Royce Houston, (18mo.)
